THE CRIME APRIL 15, 1994

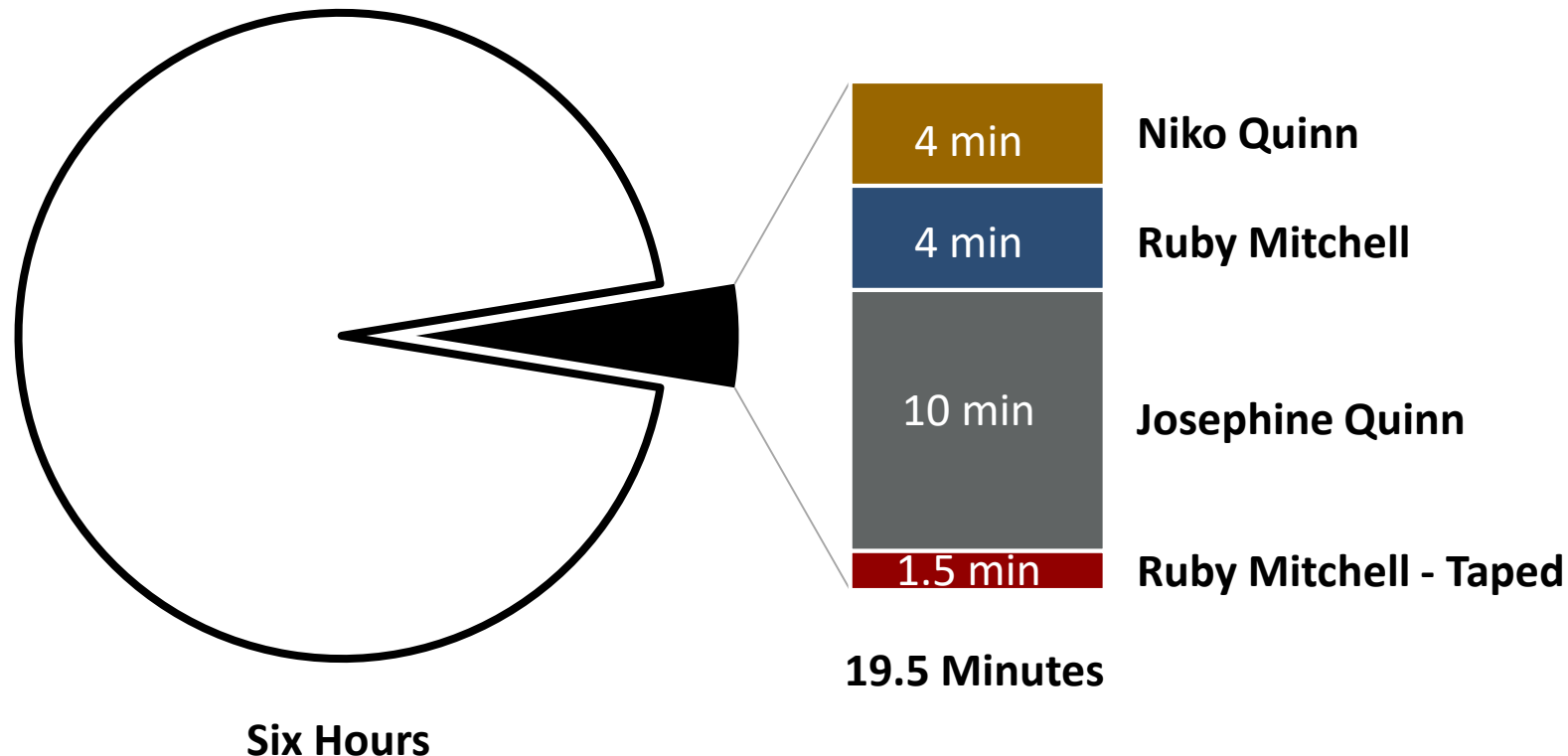
- Two men, Donald Ewing & Doniel Quinn, sitting in a car, shot at close range in broad daylight by a black male wearing all black and toting a shotgun
- Shooter turns and flees on foot, running uphill through vacant lot to getaway car on next street
- Several witnesses see the shooting, including three who are related to both victims





The Power of a Chronology

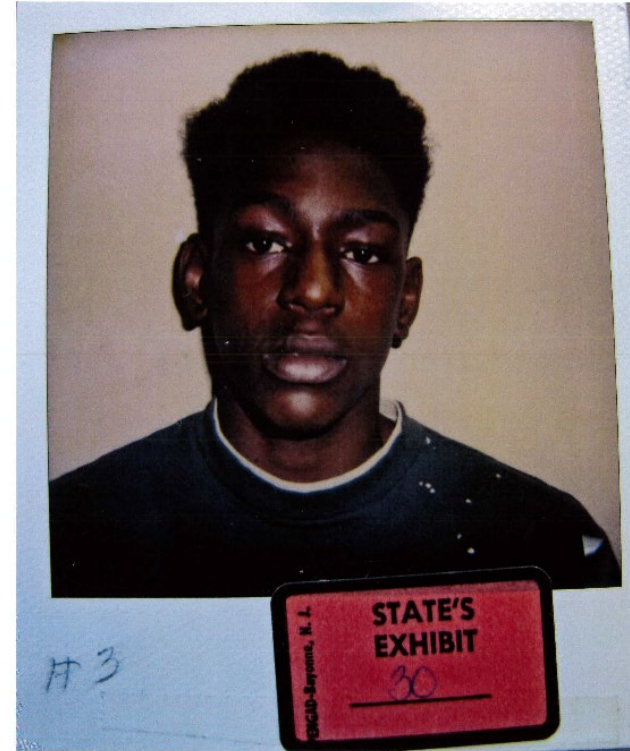
Total Time Detectives Interviewed Witnesses

TRIAL

- Ruby Mitchell testifies that Lamonte was the shooter.
- Niko Quinn testifies that Lamonte was the shooter.
- No motive evidence was presented.
- Lamonte presents alibi that he was with family.

NEW EVIDENCE

- **Ruby's Identification was manipulated/coerced.**
 - Of the 5 photos in the line-up, three are members of the McIntyre family.
 - Ruby provides the first and last name of someone she says she did not know and never met.
- **Niko Quinn recants her identification**
 - Prosecutor threatened to take away her kids & a contempt charge if she did not testify it was Lamonte.
- **Josephine Quinn was sent away after she told the prosecutor that Lamonte was not the shooter.** Stacy Quinn also says it was not Lamonte.



NEW EVIDENCE

- The Prosecutor & Judge previously had an intimate relationship that was not disclosed.
 - Judge remains on the bench
 - Prosecutor now a AUSA

ORDER RELEASING DEFENDANT FROM CUSTODY AND DISMISSAL OF 94CR1213

COMES NOW, the State of Kansas, by and through District Attorney Mark Dupree Sr., and the defendant, by and through Cheryl Pilate.

WHEREAS, the Court has found that manifest justice exists to believe the defendant should be granted the opportunity for a new trial in 94CR1213. The State requests the case be dismissed following this ruling. The Court grants this request, and 94CR1213 is dismissed.

WHEREAS, all matters before the Court involving the defendant have ceased, and the 29th Judicial District has no jurisdiction to hold the defendant in custody, this Court orders the defendant be released.
